## PROLIFE FACTS

The latest annual abortion figures were released on 1st November "with pleasure" by the Director General of Health. 14,164 babies were aborted in 2022, 907 more than in 2021. One third were repeat abortions. The workforce enabling and administrating abortions has increased from 162 to 348 men and women.

Abortions can be accessed for any reason up to 20 weeks and then on to birth, if her doctor or other qualified clinician believes the abortion is 'clinically appropriate', and that continuing the pregnancy would endanger her 'wellbeing'. The clinician has to consult with another doctor / appropriate health professional. While working towards a society that values life from conception to natural death, pro-life Christians continue to pray and work together to provide support and practical help to women facing an unexpected pregnancy.
