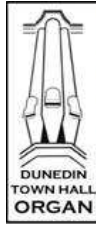

Laetare means to rejoice

The day takes its name from the opening words of today's Mass:

"Laetare, Jerusalem"

"Rejoice, O Jerusalem"

Entrance Antiphon: Isaiah 66:10-11

ALSO KNOWN AS:

Mothering Sunday,
Refreshment Sunday,
Mid-Lent Sunday,
Mi-Carême,
Mediana or
Rose Sunday

What's different?

- Priests may wear rose vestments at Mass
- Flowers may adorn the Altar
- The organ may be played

Why celebrate it?

Laetare Sunday provides us **encouragement** as we progress toward the end of Lent. Today is a small break from the penitential season that reminds us of the joy and hope ahead at Easter.

PROLIFE FACTS

Auckland Voice for Life hosted a very successful Training Day on 2nd March. One hundred people heard from legal, medical and ethics practitioners including Alex Penk from Ethos and Brendan Malone from Lifenet; lawyers Ian Bassett and Owen Posthuma; medical doctor Martin Ng, Mike Porteous from Hub of Hope and Marina Young from the Buttons Project.

The barrister Ian Bassett described the legal definitions of conscience in New Zealand's abortion law. Ian pointed out that the right of medical practitioners to exercise conscientious objection over abortion is limited. Doctors can be required to resign if their exercise of conscientious objection causes "unreasonable disruption" in services in their workplace.
