PROLIFE FACTS

A 40 Days for Life vigil is currently in

progress in the United States and other locations. The vigil commenced on September 25th and will conclude on November 3rd.

40 Days for Life vigils are internally coordinated campaigns aimed at ending abortion locally. They have been very successful in promoting awareness of the sanctity of life, and offering information and support to pregnant women, families, and abortion workers.

Since the inception of the vigils in 2007, 24,919 baby's lives have been saved, 155 abortion centres have closed, and 263 abortion workers have left the abortion industry.

There are three main facets to the 40 Days for Life vigils: 1) community outreach; 2) prayer and fasting; and 3) holding peaceful vigils nearby to abortion businesses. Not only do the vigils save lives, but they provide a powerful reminder to the local community about the sanctity of every human life, born or unborn.
