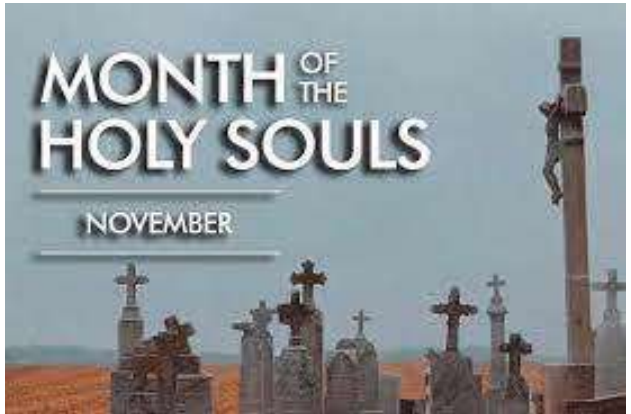
## **WORKING BEE - *Removal of the Cathedral Wall Rubble***
