## Laudato Si' Reflection

**John 2:13:** "... Stop making my Father's house a house of trade..." Is our consumerist/throwaway method of trade turning God's Temple into a rubbish tip? **LS #21:** "The earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more like an immense pile of filth. In many parts of the planet, ...beautiful landscapes are now covered with rubbish".
