## DIOCESAN INSURANCE FUND

Over recent weeks all the parishes in the diocese have chosen to cease paying insurance and begin paying into a 'self-insurance' fund. Parish Finance Committees recognise that the new fund is not a 'like-for-like' fund and that in most cases a church or parish building would not be rebuilt. Thank you to everyone who has participated in this discussion. Please note: Our parish buildings will no longer be insured from 31 May 2024.

Your Parish Finance Committee will be working through a Disaster Management Plan to make sure that everyone is clear from the beginning what buildings and eventualities will be covered by the new 'self-insurance' fund. Further details are on the diocesan web page

## PETITION TO PARLIAMENT TO REPEAL EOLC ACT

The End of Life Choice Act will be reviewed this year by Parliament. David Seymour, leader of ACT and his colleagues will be seeking to increase the number of the vulnerable in our community who will be eligible to receive a lethal injection or to be assisted in suicide. Right to Life seeks not the amendment of this dangerous legislation, but its repeal. Defend life by signing this petition calling on Parliament to repeal the EOLC Act

### PROLIFE FACTS

40 Days for Life is a pro-life endeavour that began in 2007 and has flourished, spreading throughout the world to an amazing 64 nations. It has involved a staggering 1,000,000 volunteers and 20,000 churches. 12,358 campaigns have now taken place, where the volunteers provide constant prayerful witness nearby to abortion facilities over a 40 day period. The campaigns have had wonderful results, with the lives of 24,801 unborn babies saved, 261 abortion workers leaving their jobs, and 154 abortion facilities closed.

The co-founder of 40 Days for Life, Shawn Carney, started in the pro-life movement as a student at university. He is now the President/CEO of the 40 Days for Life organisation and spreads the pro-life message as an international speaker, and through co-authoring books and producing pro-life documentaries. His books include “40 Days for Life: Discover What God Has Done ... Imagine What He Can Do” and “The Beginning of the End of Abortion”.
